Declaration of co-operation of Data Protection Authorities in Initiative 20i7

Data Protection Authorities (DPAs) of Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Kosovo, Macedonia, Montenegro, Serbia and Slovenia (alphabetical order) at the initiative of the Information Commissioner of the Republic of Slovenia:

Realising that personal data are the currency of the knowledge-based information economy;

Recognising that international flows of data and rapid development of information and communication technologies require stronger co-operation and sharing of experiences between supervisory authorities;

Considering that we share a significant amount of similar geographical, historical and legal frameworks;

Noting that our agencies face similar problems and challenges for protection of personal data posed by reform of EU legislation, increasing digitalisation and global transfers of personal data;

Considering that sharing our experiences and skills could improve the quality of our services in assuring a high level of protection of personal data;

Realising that our co-operation may be regarded as an example of good practice in bringing the region together by overcoming political and other differences;

the DPAs gathered together at the inaugural meeting of Initiative 20i7 consider it an important priority to strengthen their co-operation and sharing of experience.

Consequently, the DPAs agree to participate in Initiative 20i7 and that:


- an annual meeting of DPAs is organized in a rotating manner,
- the focus of the meeting is professional and expert co-operation in the field of personal data protection not influenced by or subjected to political differences or issues,

- the aim of the annual meeting is to discuss current issues in data protection, exchange of best practices and experience,
- there shall be no official language and no interpretation services as the idea is to speak freely to extent that we all understand each other,
- the DPAs may issue common press releases but will not adopt written opinions or other written documents,
- the DPAs may agree on other actions they deem necessary to foster a higher level of protection of personal data.




Data Protection Authority of Croatia


